The Supreme Court by rule relaxation order dated April 5, 2017 (copy attached) has established a standard process and criteria for waivers of court filing and copy fees based on indigence. The Court's order relaxes Rules 1:13-2 ("Proceedings by Indigents") and Rule 2:7 ("Appeals by Indigent Persons"), effective immediately, pending adoption of conforming rule amendments.

As set forth in the order, court filing and/or copy fees may be waived "by reason of poverty" for litigants "(a) whose household income does not exceed 150% of the federal poverty level (with that level based on the number of members of the individual's household) and (b) who have no more than \$2500 in liquid assets, subject to completion and submission of a uniform fee waiver request form promulgated by the Administrative Director of the Courts and with eligibility for waiver to be determined based on the applicant meeting the above income and assets standards and providing the court with the required proof of eligibility." The referenced uniform fee waiver request form is attached in the form of a fee waiver packet. [Note: The packet was updated April 20, 2017.]

The order further provides that "[i]f the court determines that the complaint, application, motion, appeal, petition, or other filing is frivolous or malicious or constitutes an abuse of process, the court may deny such waiver of court filing and copy fees in

noncriminal matters, unless otherwise provided for by law." Further, "[t]he provisions of this order are separate from issues related to Public Defender eligibility and Form 5A applications as well as protocols for permitting defendants to pay financial penalties in installments in the municipal courts."

Thus, litigants seeking a waiver of court fees or copy fees based on indigence must complete and submit the forms contained in the attached fee waiver packet.

As set forth in the packet, Legal Services of New Jersey and its associated regional legal services programs, as well as public interest or legal services organizations, law school clinical or pro bono programs that have been certified by the Supreme Court pursuant to Rule 1:21-11 for fee waiver status are exempt from filing fees and thus are not required to make a request for a fee waiver in individual cases.

SUPREME COURT OF NEW JERSEY

Pursuant to N.J. Const. Art. VI., sec. 2, par. 3, it is ORDERED that the provisions of Rule 1:13-2 ("Proceedings by Indigents") and Rule 2:7 ("Appeals by Indigent Persons") of the Rules Governing the Courts of the State of New Jersey are supplemented and relaxed so as to permit waiver of court filing and copy fees by reason of poverty for litigants (a) whose household income does not exceed 150% of the federal poverty level (with that level based on the number of members of the individual's household) and (b) who have no more than \$2500 in liquid assets, subject to completion and submission of a uniform fee waiver request form promulgated by the Administrative Director of the Courts and with eligibility for waiver to be determined based on the applicant meeting the above income and assets standards and providing the court with the required proof of eligibility. If the court determines that the complaint, application, motion, appeal, petition, or other filing is frivolous or malicious or constitutes an abuse of process, the court may deny such waiver of court filing and copy fees in noncriminal matters, unless otherwise provided for by law. The provisions of this order are separate from issues related to Public Defender eligibility and Form 5A applications as well as protocols for permitting defendants to pay financial penalties in installments in the municipal courts. This order shall be effective immediately and shall continue in effect pending adoption of conforming rule amendments.

General- Fee Waiver How to File a Fee Waiver April 2017



How to File for a Fee Waiver –All Courts Who Should Use This Packet?

You should use this packet if you believe that you cannot afford to pay the filing fees in your case. This form may be used when applying for a fee waiver in the Supreme Court, Appellate Division, Superior Court and Tax Court. This request is based upon your financial need. It requires the submission of financial records/documents in order for a judge to determine if your filing fees should be waived. This request can be filed by any party prior to and at any point during the lawsuit, except where a party is requesting a waiver of filing fees for the Supreme Court and Superior Court, Appellate Division. Please note that Rule 1:5-6 directs the clerk of the court to return papers as "received, but not filed," when they are not accompanied by the required filing fee. For this reason, the filing fee or application to waive filing fee should accompany any filing that requires a fee. This packet explains how to file this request.

Legal Services of New Jersey and its associated regional legal services programs, as well as public interest or legal services organizations, law school clinical or pro bono programs that have been certified by the Supreme Court pursuant to Rule 1:21-11 for fee waiver status are exempt from filing fees and thus are not required to make a request for a fee waiver in individual cases.

Where the person filing these forms is requesting a waiver of fees in the Superior Court, Appellate Division, the application must first be made in the trial court pursuant to Rule 2:7-1. If the request is denied in the trial court, within 20 days, the person requesting the fee waiver may then apply for a fee waiver in the Appellate Division. If the person is requesting a waiver of fees in an appeal of an administrative agency determination, the application must be filed in the Appellate Division. For questions related to where the application should be filed, please contact the Superior Court Clerk's Office at (609) 421-6100.

With limited exceptions, any paper filed with the court can be looked at by the public upon request. You may only file this request on behalf of yourself and not for anyone else. A Power of Attorney does not allow you to file on behalf of anyone else.

In the trial courts, if you are granted a fee waiver and are awarded more than \$2,000 in that same matter, you will be responsible to repay any and all fees waived by the court, as determined by court order.

Please follow the instructions included in this packet and make sure that all documents in support of this request are attached. You will be required to complete the following:

 FORM A – Certification/Petition/Application in Support of Fee Waiver Attach your financial records/documentation to the Certification/Petition/Application

FORM B – Order Waiving Filing Fees

Your fee waiver application may **not** be granted if you do not include all required income documentation. The court may request additional income verification, including but not limited to, state and federal tax returns and other sources of income. Keep a copy of whatever you file with the Court for your own records.

Note: These materials have been prepared by the New Jersey Administrative Office of the Courts for use by self-represented litigants. The instructions and forms will be periodically updated as necessary to reflect current New Jersey statutes and court rules. The most recent version of the forms will be available on the Judiciary's Internet site www.njcourts.gov. However, you are ultimately responsible for the content of your court papers.

Completed forms for the Supreme Court, Appellate Division and Tax Court are to be submitted to the respective Clerk's Office. Completed forms for the Superior Court are to be submitted to the courthouse in the county where you are going to file your case or where the case is already filed. A listing of the courthouse is available at njcourts.gov. For questions related to where the application should be filed, please contact the Superior Court Clerk's Office at (609) 421-6100.

INSTRUCTIONS

The numbered steps listed below tell you what forms you will need to fill out and what to do with them. Each form should be typed or printed clearly on $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" white paper only. Forms may not be filed on a different size or color paper.

Steps for Filing a Fee Waiver FORM A

Complete the Certification/Petition/Application in Support of a Fee Waiver (Form A).

The Certification/Petition/Application in Support of a Fee Waiver tells the court the reasons why you want the fee waiver and the facts supporting why the court should grant your request. In the Certification/Petition/Application you will make a disclosure of your financial and employment situation.

- 1. At the top left of the form enter your name(s), address(es) and phone number(s). If you have an email address(es), include that as well.
- 2. On the line labeled *Plaintiff(s)/Appellant(s)*, type or print the plaintiff's name(s). Plaintiff is the person or business entity who files the complaint in a lawsuit. An appellant is the person or business entity requesting the appeal. Business entities requesting a fee waiver are required to be represented by an attorney pursuant to Rule 1:21-1(c).
- 3. On the line labeled *Defendant(s)/Respondent(s)*, enter the name(s) of the defendants listed on the complaint. *Defendant* is the person or business entity being sued. A respondent is the person defending the appeal.
- 4. On the line labeled *County*, enter the county where the case is filed only if applying for a fee waiver in the Superior Court.
- 5. On the line labeled *Docket Number*, enter the docket number, if one has been assigned. This information can be found if a complaint was served on you or if an appeal has been filed.
- 6. Enter your name(s) and if you are the plaintiff(s)/appellant(s) or defendant(s)/respondent(s) on the line that says "I/We, am/are the plaintiff(s)/appellant(s)/defendant(s)/respondent(s) in the above-captioned matter.)"
- 7. Identify if you are an inmate on the line that says "I/We _____ (am/am not/are/are not) an inmate in State prison or County Jail."
- 8. Identify if you have been determined eligible for *Public Assistance* and/or *Social Security Disability*. You must provide your most recent award statement as proof of eligibility.
- 9. Attach copies of all requested information as indicated on this form.

You must include the last three digits or numbers of any documents referenced below. However, you **must** also certify that you have removed or blacked out the remaining numbers or digits (confidential personal identifiers) from any of the following documents filed with the court:

- Social Security numbers,
- driver's license numbers,
- · vehicle plate numbers,
- insurance policy numbers,
- active financial account numbers or
- active credit card numbers.

Do not redact (black out) any information in the original papers that you are keeping (such as a bank statement) since you may have to show them to the court at some point.

- 10. Enter your employer's name and information in the box that says "Employer's Name, Address and Telephone Number."
- 11. Fill in the financial information requested in the box. The judge requires your asset information and how much money you receive monthly from all sources.
- 12. Date, print and sign your name. **Note**: When you sign this form, you are certifying that the statements made on the form are true. If you willfully make false statements, you may be subject to punishment.

All fee waiver applications must be filed at the courthouse or appropriate Clerk's office where you are going to file your case or where the case is already filed. A complete list of Courthouses can be found at the Judiciary's website www.njcourts.gov.

FORM B

Complete the proposed form of Order (Form B)

Fill in the information at the top of the page up to where you identify yourself as a plaintiff or defendant. Leave the line for the date of the Order and the rest of the form blank. The terms of the Order will be completed by the judge when the application is decided.

- 1. At the top left of the form enter your name(s), address(es) and phone number(s). If you have an e-mail address(es), include that as well.
- 2. On the line labeled *Plaintiff(s)/Appellant(s)*, type or print the plaintiff's name. Plaintiff is the person or business entity who files the complaint in a lawsuit. An appellant is the person or business entity requesting the appeal. Business entities, other than sole proprietorships, requesting a fee waiver are required to be represented by an attorney pursuant to Rule 1:21-1(c).
- 3. On the line labeled *Defendant(s)/ Respondent(s)* enter the name(s) of the defendants listed on the complaint. *Defendant* is the person or business entity being sued. A respondent is the person defending the appeal.
- 4. On the line labeled *County*, enter the county where the case is filed (only in the Superior Court.)
- 5. On the line labeled *Docket Number*, enter the docket number, if one has been assigned. This information can be found if a complaint was served on you or if an appeal has been filed.

- 6. Enter your name(s) and if you are the plaintiff(s)/appellant(s) or defendant(s)/respondent(s) on the line that says "application of ______ (plaintiff(s)/appellant(s)/defendant(s)/respondent(s))."
- 7. DO NOT fill out anything that appears under the text "For Court Use Only." The judge will complete the remaining information.

Check Your Completed Forms and Make Copies
Mail or Deliver Form A (Certification/Petition/Application in Support of a Fee Waiver), Form B (Proposed Form of Order) and all documentation to the Court.

You are required to provide a copy of Forms A and B to all named parties in the action, and to provide proof of service to the court where petition/application is made. If appellate filing fees are sought and the application is made in the trial court, a copy of the motion and proof of service must also be sent to the appellate court. Please black out all personal and confidential information, such as Social Security numbers, driver's license numbers, vehicle plate numbers, insurance policy numbers, active financial account numbers or active credit card numbers.

Partial Fee Waivers

Directive #03-17 ("Fee Waivers Based on Indigence...") (issued April 7, 2017 and updated April 20, 2017) promulgated a standard fee waiver application form for use in all courts. The standard form was issued as part of a fee waiver packet. That Directive also established criteria for fee waiver eligibility, including certain income limitations and verification requirements. This Supplement clarifies the fee waiver procedure with regard to partial waivers. Specifically, where an applicant makes a request for a fee waiver, that application must be granted or denied in full. Partial fee waivers should not be granted.

Applications from inmates are the one limited exception to this policy. Under N.J.S.A. 30:4-16.3 ("Waiver of filing fee; part payment"), inmates may file applications for partial fee waivers. However, in light of the revised standards and advances in technology, and in the interest of uniformity and consistency, if an inmate seeking a partial waiver meets the requirements for a fee waiver, a full fee waiver rather than a partial waiver should be granted absent special circumstances.

The vicinages shortly will be provided with a detailed protocol for the uniform handling of fee waiver requests.
