Family - Juvenile - Functional Equivalent to Juvenile Pre-Disposition Report (PDR) -

Standardized Form

This Directive promulgates for immediate use, the standardized *Functional Equivalent to PDR* (Pre-Disposition Report) form, as had been approved by the Supreme Court. This standardized form is in furtherance of implementation of the Court's 2004 amendment to <u>R.</u> 5:24-4(b), *Order of Probation or Commitment*, authorizing the use of PDR functional equivalents.

Preparation of a pre-disposition report (PDR) is required in cases where a juvenile is committed to a correctional facility. A PDR is a formal and comprehensive document that sets out information gathered by court staff about the offenses with which the juvenile is charged, the juvenile's family, health and schooling, prior record and other information useful to a judge in entering a disposition for the juvenile's case. In some cases, however, there already is a wealth of pre-existing information that could serve as a functional equivalent to the PDR about a juvenile who has been adjudicated delinquent and is pending disposition. Such pre-existing information might include previous PDRs; psychological, psychosocial, substance abuse, psychiatric, or child study team evaluations; needs assessments; Department of Children and Families reports from either the Division of Child Protection and Permanency (DCP&P) or the Division of Children's System of Care (DCSOC); violation of probation summaries of juvenile intensive supervision reports. Often those pre-existing documents contain the same, or even more, information than does the PDR.

In view of the foregoing and to achieve greater efficiency in the disposition process, the Supreme Court in 2004 adopted an amendment to \underline{R} . 5:24-4(b) that allowed functional equivalents to a PDR to be used in lieu of the formal PDR. Rule 5:24-4(b) thus now provides as follows:

Order of Probation or Commitment. If a juvenile is placed on probation or is committed, the order of the court shall have attached thereto a memorandum containing such information as may assist the receiving agency or institution in the treatment of the juvenile. Before a juvenile is committed to a correctional institution a pre-disposition investigation and report or other functional equivalent (such as a Juvenile Intensive Supervision Program (JISP) report or a Violation of Probation Summary shall be made and considered by the court. . . . [Emphasis supplied.]

It is in the judge's discretion as to whether to order a formal PDR or instead to use a functional equivalent. If the judge opts for the latter, the attached *Functional Equivalent to PDR* form must be completed by Family Division staff. The form requires the entry of certain information elements regarding the juvenile, such as personal identifiers and current charges, and provides for the existing report(s) – the functional equivalents – to be attached. Use of the form thus will provide judges with the information needed to enter the appropriate disposition in juvenile cases without unnecessarily duplicating the information gathering progress. Additionally, the form, designed in consultation with the Juvenile Justice Commission (JJC), will be used by the JJC in their assessment and planning for the treatment of a committed juvenile.

EDITOR'S NOTE

*2017 Update - The reference to the Division of Youth and Family Services was changed to reflect the reorganization of the Department of Children and Families effective July 2, 2012. The Division of Youth and Family Services is now the Division of Child Protection and Permanency. The reference to Youth Case Management (YCM) under Miscellaneous Information of the Functional Equivalent to the PDR form was removed because YCM no longer exists. Those YCM cases are now handled by the Care Management Organization. Acronyms also are now spelled out on the Functional Equivalent to the PDR form.
